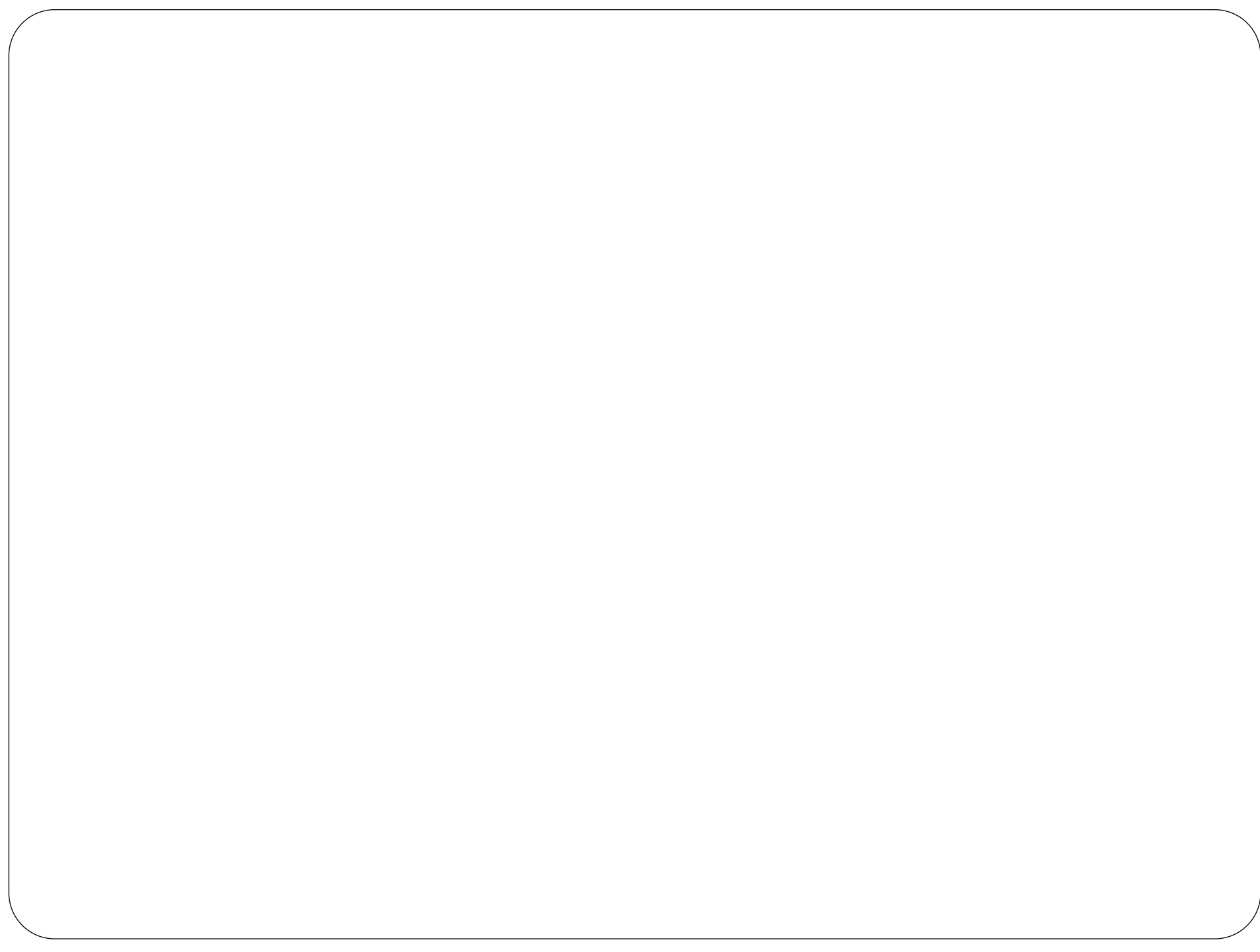

Get research help at any time on our website using our Get Help Button.

 - 24/7 online service
- **One on One Research Consultations**
 - Receive assistance in choosing a topic, finding relevant articles, books, or primary sources, or going over the steps of a research project in an in-depth manner in a one on one meeting with a librarian! 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5 Minute Research Tip



Tip 3:

Get better research results using "Boolean Logic".

Boolean Logic is a way to broaden (increase) or narrow (decrease) your research results when you are researching topics in a library database. You can also use this for Google searches!

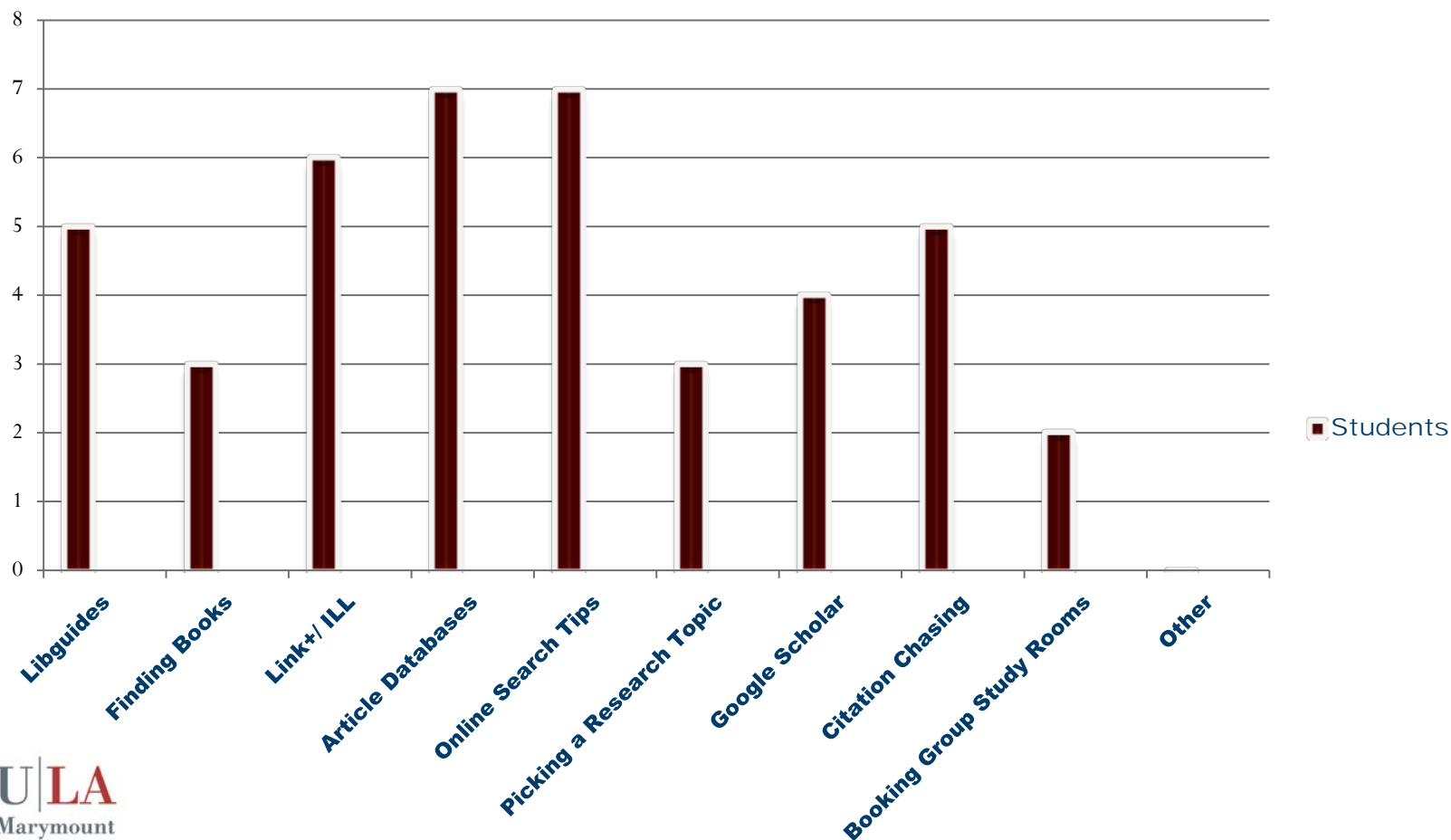
Operators	Example Search	The search will find...	Venn Diagram
AND	ham and cheese	items containing "ham" and "cheese." AND narrows a search, resulting in fewer hits.	
OR	ham or cheese	items containing either "ham" or "cheese" or both. OR broadens a search, resulting in more hits.	
NOT	ham not cheese	items containing "ham" but not "cheese."	

It works like this!

- **AND:** Use AND between two keywords to tell the library database to find articles where the two words are placed together.
 - Example: Mexican Americans AND Academic Achievement
 - Asian Americans AND racial stereotypes
- **OR:** Use OR when you have two words or phrases that mean the same thing. This will tell the computer to retrieve both terms.
 - Example: Mexican American OR Chicano
 - African American OR Black
- **NOT:** Use NOT when you want to exclude a phrase or word from your search.
 - Example: Latin American NOT Mexican American
 - Asian American NOT Japanese American

Tip 1: Research Consultations

Research Consultations are one on one meetings with a reference librarian on the topic of your choice. Consultations can be used for any project that involves research; this includes essays, presentations, annotated bibliographies, theses, or independent study. Any major or topic is welcome! Librarians will help you find articles, books, statistics, primary or secondary resources, websites and more. Consultations can be for a single individual or group (instruction sessions utilizing our library classrooms can be booked for large groups and clubs).

The library requires **two work days** (M-F) to process consultation requests. This is because a consultation may require advance research by the librarian. Please do your best to provide at least 2-3 dates and times you can meet with the librarian.

Tip 7: Get everything you need for finals.

What to do when the book you want is unavailable.



The library can borrow books from other libraries on your behalf from two services, Link+ and Interlibrary Loan. For books you should start at our catalog first (LINUS), then search Link+.

If you cannot find the book in Link+, then fill out an Interlibrary Loan form. Keep in mind these requests take 3-5 business days, so do not do this at the last minute!

If you absolutely cannot wait, the website WorldCat can search public and private libraries (<http://www.worldcat.org/>). WorldCat is not a service affiliated with LMU, so this means you will have to go directly to the library to pick up the book yourself. If you're confused, talk to a reference librarian (http://library.lmu.edu/get_help.htm).

What to do when you want to request a book in our collection.



If you're in a rush, or want to ensure that you get the book you want, you can place a request online for most books and journals and the library will retrieve them for you. Books and journals from held at the Circulation Desk on the 1st floor and all media items (DVDs/CDs etc) are on the 2nd. Just look for the red request button

Request on the library record. Online requests take up to 4-6 hours to retrieve. You will be notified in your LLMU Lion email when the item(s) are ready for pickup.


